The Pastor's Pen


Beloved Members,

What is Pentecost?

We find in this passage in Acts 2: 1, "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come." There were three annual feasts of the Jews, the Passover, Pentecost, and the Feast of Tabernacles. Pentecost celebrated the beginning of their harvest. Pentecost (term found only in the New Testament, called "Feast of Harvest," (See Ex. 23: 16) came fifty days after the Passover; hence, pente, five or fifty.

Jesus had told his apostles, "And, behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high" (Luke 24: 49). We read in Acts 1: 4 that they are in Jerusalem waiting as

Jesus had told them to do. Therefore, the language "day of Pentecost was fully come" is very significant.

The day of Pentecost in Acts 2 fulfilled many kingdom and salvation prophecies (cp. Joel 2: 28-32; Isa. 2: 2, 3, see Acts 2: 16-47). The apostles were baptized in the Holy Spirit to enable them to execute their commission, the full gospel was officially preached and Jesus' last will and testament came into being on the day of Pentecost.


The day of Pentecost was the birth of Christianity. It was on this memorable day that repentance and baptism in Jesus' name for the remission of sins was first taught and experienced (Acts 2: 38). The height of Joel's prophesy had been "whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be delivered" (Joel 2: 32). When those whose hearts had been pricked asked what must they do, were told, and did it, they were calling on the name of the Lord (Acts 2: 37-42). People today are saved similarly by calling on Jesus' name (Rom. 10: 13).

When we fully understand the significance of this event, we will see how God's chosen people, the Jews, found in the Old Testament, were selected to carry this good news of salvation. But, has now been commissioned to the *church* in the



New Testament.

There is so much in the Bible to learn. DCCCA , Red Rock, RIVUS Wellness and Research Institute and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services were also there providing brochures, NAR CAN, and lock boxes for different medicines, as well as Deterra which is used to liquefy medicinal tablets for safe disposal.

There were breakout groups on Treatment, Prevention, and How to Help a Loved One through their Addiction. The speakers, facilitators, and participants were engaged and truly learned from the information provided. The testimonies were invaluable and Continuing Education Units (CEU's) were given to those that requested them. There were local ministers and Peer Recovery Support Specialists in attendance that were very interested in all of the presentations.

A complimentary letter from a member of 5th Street Missionary Baptist Church was received. That participant was very happy that the conference was open to the public and looks forward to our next community conference.

Technology Media/Digital Ministry

"We will do anything short of sin to reach people for Jesus Christ."

Technological innovation in the local church starts with the heart and activity of God, the Great Innovator. It is time for the Church to use technology to make a statement that in the midst of chaos, emptiness, and despair there is hope in the person of Jesus Christ.

God has been innovating since the dawn of time. Humans didn't even exist when He created the world, they would one day inhabit. Before sin had cast a shadow on the planet, God had designed a remedy, the death and resurrection of His Son. Before the Gentiles understood they needed a Savior, God stopped Paul on the road to Damascus.

God is always up to something new. God never changes, but He constantly works in new ways. He says in Isaiah, "Do not remember the past events, pay no attention to things of old.

Look, I am about to do something new; even now it is coming. Do you not see it? Indeed, I will make a way in the wilderness, rivers in the desert" (Isaiah 43:18-19). From the first few words of Genesis to the closing chapters of Revelation, the Bible tells the story of God's innovative work in the world. As the classic Don Moen song says, "God makes a way when there seems to be no way." That's innovation and the heart of the gospel message. As heirs and stewards of that message, we have no choice. To love as God loves is to innovate as He innovates. If God takes innovation seriously, we must too. Eternity hangs in the balance.

Let's be wise and creative in how we utilize technology and media with purpose to reach people with the love of Jesus Christ. Television, social media, movies, advertisements, email, someone is always trying to get our attention. It's working, too. Just look at a list of the most popular tweets ever.

- A photo of President Biden and the First Lady after his 2012 re-election was shared more than 900,000 times
- A photo of a little girl walking down a winding road with the quote: "I'm guilty of giving people more chances than they deserve but when I'm done, I'm done" was shared more than 1.4 million times.
- A dog food maker's tweet promising a bowl of food to a hungry dog for every retweet was shared more than 700,000 times
- An Indonesian political analyst's tweet of support for one of the country's presidential candidates was shared nearly a million times.
- A group selfie full of A-list Hollywood stars taken after the



2014 Academy Awards was retweeted more than 3 million times.

In any list of the most viral social media shares, you'll find funny messages, caustic messages, weird messages, heartwarming messages, and even a few important messages. But you'll be hard-pressed to find one with eternal consequences. That's what sets the Church's message apart from all others, eternity hinges on it. For the Church, no message matters more than what Jude calls the "faith that was delivered to the saints once for all" (1:3). Generations of committed Jesusfollowers have laid down their lives for this gospel message that stitches together both life and death.

We, the Church, need to be the ones pushing the boundaries and innovating. If the church's message is the most important message on the planet, our distribution methods for it should be at least as innovative as anything else. Maybe the late theologian Carl F.H. Henry said it best, "The gospel is only good news when it gets there on time." Innovation in the Church must happen so the gospel gets where it's going before it's too late.

Preserving the Right to Vote

Too many Americans take the Right to Vote for granted. I urge you to watch the proposed bills and discussions that are currently happening in the Oklahoma and US legislatures. Our right to choose is slowly eroding in plain sight. During the week of March 19, 2023, the Oklahoma legislature proposed bills that should concern all state residents. Two examples are a bill to assess residents a flat fee for utility bills with no

public disclosure on how the fee will be calculated. For example, my home is total electric and I have a water well. Will my fee include gas and water? Another bill will allow teachers to carry guns in the classroom and the only stated requirement is possession of a conceal and carry license. What if a teacher feels threatened by a student or another teacher? Will the teacher be protected by the "Stand Your Ground Law" which allows a person to defend themselves even though it puts children in danger of misfired and ricocheted bullets.

Rights can be removed, lost and nullified by actions of the

("Preserving the Right To Vote" continued from page 6 state and federal legislatures. Protect your right to vote by educating yourself and voting in every election for which you are eligible to vote. Most people think America is a Democracy. America is not a pure democracy. America is a Constitutional Republic or a Democratic Republic. The difference is that in a democracy, the people are self-ruled. In a Republic, residents choose a group of citizens to vote on their behalf with the vote being influenced by the people. The only way to have your voice heard is to VOTE. The best way to ensure you are heard in every election in Oklahoma is to go to OK Voter Portal and register for an Absentee **Ballot.** You must be registered to vote; then each year you must register for an Absentee Ballot. Once registered, you will receive a ballot in the mail for every local, state or national election for which you are eligible to vote. The process is simple and helps to preserve your Right to Vote.
