That missionary was completing his kingdom assignment to spread the gospel, but so were the 27 church members. You don't need a passport to fulfill the Great Commission. Through the fervent prayer of the people at home, that missionary and his family were able to safely continue carrying out the call God had for them in reaching people in a distant nation!

What do the scriptures teach on baptism?

The scriptures do not teach baptism is "an outward sign of an inward grace." The word of God does not teach baptism is sprinkling or pouring – it is immersion, as the word suggests (see Rom. 6:4, Col. 2:12). The New Testament does not teach baptism renders one sinless the remainder of their life (Acts 8:13 – 24). Neither do the scriptures teach baptism is simply the means of membership in the local church (Acts 9:18-26).


One must realize that baptism is one of the first steps in obedience for a believer. We find in Matt. 3:13-15 that Jesus himself was baptized.

Baptism is "for the remission of sin" (Acts 2:38). Those who argue "for" means "because of" need to see Acts 22:16, "...arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins..." Scriptural baptism places one in the spiritual body of Christ where salvation is realized (Gal. 3:27, 2 Tim. 2:10). Baptism is the "answer of a good conscience toward God" (1 Pet. 3:21). Baptism "saves" (1 Pet.3: 21). İn baptism the old man of sin is crucified, and one arises to walk in newness of life (Rom. 6:3-6). Baptism is a command of God (Acts 10:48). Baptism is part of that "form of doctrine" which

one obeys to cease being a "servant of sin" and to become a "servant of righteousness" (Rom. 6:17,18,1–18). Baptism is for the lost sinner (Mk. 16:16). Baptism is for responsible individuals who are capable of believing (Mk. 16:16). Baptism is to "fulfill all righteousness" (Matt. 3:15).

We as members of the church should make sure that we understand baptism, often children think that it is a "play thing" allowed in church. Baptism is not to be ignored if you are a believer.

The scriptures portray water baptism as the last God-or-



dained act standing between the lost and their salvation. Belief, repentance, and confession precede "before" baptism (Mk. 16:16, Acts 2:38, 8:35-37). Have you been scripturally baptized?

What is a QR Code?



The "QR" in the QR code stands for "Quick Response". It's a two-dimensional matrix barcode that can be read and scanned with compatible devices such as a smartphone camera or an app. We will connect with our congregation virtually, celebrate all of the ministry impact and create practical ways to meet the needs of our members.

One of the most significant post-pandemic changes is how churches have started using technology to serve their members and people connected to their ministries. Churches have been quick to join the world of virtual communication. That's why QR codes are an excellent way to modernize our church and relate to more people.

This versatile tool helps our church get more out of our traditional and print ministry materials. We can bridge our churches' traditions to the digital world using a reliable QR code online to grant instant access to communication and information. QR codes allow churches to provide a contactless experience, reduce waste and save more money. For example, our church bulletin QR code or guest cards for Sunday morning announcements minimize paper waste. They can make signing up for events more accessible and easier to donate online.



Anyone with a smartphone can access the embedded information in the QR code with one quick scan, making this tech tool beneficial for our church. Users can scan a QR code to get the necessary information without typing in web addresses or clicking through several links.

Churches now use technology that focus on attracting members to attend service after the world experienced the pandemic. According to Pew Foundation, about 17 million Americans visited church websites regularly. Churches can use this advantage to relay information and schedules to members conveniently.

To avoid long queues at religious sites, churches can use QR codes to let people register and worship at different times to control the number of visitors. Linking a QR code to sermons, the Bible, and other religious texts is a great way to help visitors use QR Codes in our church. Additionally, we can link the QR codes to an audio version of the verse of the week or related messages to aid members who have difficulties reading or listening for more inclusive worship.

Opiod Addiction Awareness Day-2023

The Family Support Ministry will recognize International Overdose Awareness Day by having an Informational Session on Wednesday, August 30th from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. in the M.L. Jemison Conference Center. The actual day is recognized on August 31st. We have requested that the Sky Dance Bridge be lit up in Purple to commemorate this event and the City has granted our request again!!

This ministry has brought awareness to the community on this subject starting in 2016. In 2018 we had our last session which included the Attorney General of Oklahoma, Drug Court Judge Kenneth Stoner, representatives from the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, and the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics. Because of COVID we had a lapse in activity but just this past February we partnered with the Oklahoma Faith Network in presenting a Substance Abuse Conference regarding the Faith Response to Substance Abuse/Opioid Addiction.

This year we will have representative from the OU College of Medicine speak to us about the effects on the family, the brain, and the body regarding Fentanyl and other drug use. A representative from Hope Is Alive, Bishop Terrance Haynes from the Ideal State of Mind Christian Counseling Services, Judge Kenneth Stoner, and two personal testimonies concerning drug use/overdose.

The public is invited to attend with emphasis on churches that have Support Groups, Sober Living and Treatment facilities, students, and family members that are supporting those that can be helped by the information presented. Various vendors will be on hand with resources and information.

We know that everything happens after prayer and that the Lord will be with all of us during this period of planning. We invite you to come and gain some knowledge so that you will be able to be a blessing to others.

Oklahoma Election Poll Workers

Election Poll Workers are volunteer voters dedicated to democracy and our representative form of government. They care about their community, the right to vote and the integrity of the election process. Training for poll workers is mandatory and provided for all volunteers. Volunteers get to watch democracy in progress. Their workdays are election days in the county served from poll opening to after the poll closes (7 a.m. to 7 p.m.).

They receive fixed pay for hours worked. Voters who desire to be poll workers must be registered to vote in the county served and demonstrate competency to perform the duties of a poll worker.
