
The Pastor's Pen

Who were the apostles?


Just as with most subjects, there are numerous mistaken ideas about the apostles. The word apostle is from the Greek apostolos. Apostolos is a compound word meaning, apo, from, and stello, to send. Therefore apostle literally identifies one who was sent. We must note that disciples are those who follow the teachings of Christ. Disciples and Apostle was used interchangeably within the New Testament, you and I are disciples, in some circles of belief the "title" Apostle has been given to individuals based upon being commissioned by their religious body. This is a very controversial subject and I will not address all of the issues it presents; however if our under-

standing of scripture is correct we have all been commissioned or "sent" by the Lord Jesus Matthew 28:18-20 (KJV) 18 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. 19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: 20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

The first time apostle appears is in Matthew 10: 2. Luke tells us Jesus "called unto him his disciples and of them he chose twelve, whom also he named apostles" (Luke 6: 13).

Their names are listed (Matt. 10: 2-4). All the apostles, including Matthias and Paul who were chosen later, were divinely selected. On occasion, apostle is simply used of one sent without reference to the twelve (14 in all) apostles (Heb. 3: 1, Acts 14: 14).

The apostles had miraculous power during the limited commission (Matt. 10: 6-23). Later, they were baptized in the Holy Spirit (Luke 24: 49, Acts 1: 5-8, 2: 1-13). Not only did they possess all the gifts (1 Cor. 12: 8-10), but they could pass on the ability to work miracles (Acts 8: 13-18). To these men the whole truth was revealed (John 14: 26, 16:13). To be an apostle, one had to meet certain



qualifications (Acts 1: 21,22, see 1 Cor. 15: 4-9 for the case of Paul).

The apostleship was important in establishing the infant church and in revealing God's truth (cf. Acts 2: 42, Eph. 2:20). Most of the New Testament was written by the inspired apostles.

Join us each Wednesday at noon and 6:00 p.m. as we study from the book of John "the beloved Disciple/Apostle."

Juandalyn was honored to be Pastor's Wife of St. Andrew Baptist Church of Tulsa, OK where her husband had served as Pastor for 38 years. At St. Andrew, she is and has always been a faithful tither, serves as an usher, volunteers with the Food Pantry Ministry and is active in the teaching ministry of the church.

Her past ministry obligations include serving as a Deaconess on the Nurse's Guild, active with the Women's Mission, Sunday School and volunteering with the Culinary Ministry. She served 33 years as the Administrative Secretary of St. Andrew, alongside of husband. She retired from St. Andrew on December 31, 2018. Juandalyn's Christian walk has not been limited to service at her local church. She has served as a certified Instructor and Dean of the National Baptist Congress (NBC) Christian Education Department. In 2017, she was appointed by the President of the National Baptist Convention USA Inc. (Dr. Jerry Young) to serve as a Judge for the convention's Oratorical contest. Her youngest son, Mr. BerThaddaeus Bailey, serves as the oratorical Director.

In Creek District Baptist Association, she has served as past President of the Woman's Auxiliary, past President of the Minister's Wives & Widows Auxiliary and she spearheaded the Creek District Christmas Food Basket Ministry for 20 years and ministered to more than 2,500 families. In the Oklahoma Baptist State Convention, she served as past President of the Pastor's/Minister's Wives and Widows Auxiliary and was an Instructor for the Con-

gress of Christian Education. God has blessed her with many unmerited opportunities to speak and teach in Oklahoma, Texas, and Louisiana. She is in the process of writing a book for Pastor's Wives and Women in general.

Juandalyn ventured out in 2018 to take a 14-day tour of the Holy Lands/Jerusalem and surrounding cities. Her greatest joys were to visit Jesus' birthplace, Bethlehem, the Tomb; where they laid Him, being baptized in the Jordan River, sailing on the Sea of Galilee and praying at the 'wailing wall.' She describes the trip as a life changing experience.

In addition to reading, gardening and spending time with family and friends, Juandalyn has a great passion for spending time with the senior saints, visiting the sick and those experiencing bereavement. For the last 5 years of her husband's life and throughout his illness, Mrs. Bailey lovingly and meticulously ministered to him. On February 14th, 2018, Juandalyn's status changed from wife to widow. She is in a new and challenging season of her life. But God has been her EVERYTHING! Truly, the Struggle is Real!!!

Recently, in December 2022, Juandalyn completed an accredited course to become a Certified Nurse's Assistant. Juandalyn is the founder and CEO of the JJ Bailey Ministries, Inc., organized in 2019. One of her goals is to reach women who have become widows and to help them journey through this new path without their husbands. A Widow's Conference will be held in Tulsa in the Fall of 2023. "A Widow's Haven" is in the developmental stages, as a sanctuary for solace and support.



The use of technology is a major driving factor in today's culture. People are influenced by technology in both lifestyles and habits. Think about the last time your Wi-Fi went down in your home or office, I'm sure it left you at a stand still. Or think of a time when you misplaced

your cell phone, I don't doubt that it sent you into instant anxiety. Technological advancements have made life more proficient, closed communication gaps, enhanced graphic imagery, and provided overall enhancements to the quality of life. While technology has en-

hanced society in many ways, the church has been hesitant to embrace it. Church technology can be utilized to further share the gospel, not to distract from it.

More than ever before, we need to capitalize on the use of technology to tell the story and message of Jesus Christ. Instead of being slow to adopt and use



these tools, what if the church began to use technology and its ever-changing advancements first? What if the church used technology to influence this current culture with the transforming message of Jesus? What if...?

Jesus was a master at connecting with people. In a like manner, believers today should strive for new and innovative ways to connect with people, all with the goal of bringing them to Him.
