Beloved Members,


I pray that this edition of our monthly Beacon finds you and the family in the best of health and spirit. Given the many challenges we face and juggle on a daily bases, it is easy to become discouraged and develop a distorted perspective. I want to encourage you to set aside some time in meditation with Lord. Let His presence and His Word replenish you.

In light of the upcoming celebration of Easter, I want to share a meditation that really speaks to the essence of the moment:

Our acceptance in God's eyes is a no-strings-attached gift. It isn't a reward for our good behavior. It's not something we can pay God back for by doing all the things we think he wants us to do. God gave us our salvation. Jesus paid a high price for it, so it wasn't free; but it's free to us. It's a gift that he wanted us to have because he is good and loving.

Paul said it like this: "It is by grace you have been saved, through faith — and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God — not by works, so that no one can boast" (Ephesians 2:8 – 9).

God's grace is hard to grasp because in our world nothing comes for free. Grace is the way of God because that's how deep his love goes. Is it awkward? Yes it is. Particularly, when we realize Jesus died to save us and there's nothing we can do to earn our

salvation. It is a glimpse of how deep God's love and goodness goes. It seems almost too good to be true; but it is! It's love beyond anything we could ever repay. It's too much. It's too good. And, well, that's who God is. He is too good. He is too much. His love is overwhelming!

And so, when we falter or fail, the Cross of Calvary is the compass for our recovery. Remind yourself of what Jesus death, burial and resurrection has accomplished. Then, even though it's difficult, bring your sin and guilt to God and receive the love that he offers in exchange. Sit in the intensity of the moment; don't run from it. As you experience the many emotions of the moment, know this: You're experiencing the loving intensity of a God who so loved that he willingly sacrificed His only son. This is God's heart. He is audaciously loving, shockingly kind and unfailingly forgiving. Let it sink in! Let Calvary marinate in your spirit. Let Calvary bring healing to your soul.

The 78th City-Wide Simultaneous Revival will be held immediately following Easter Sunday, which falls on April 17th this year. Many of God's best preachers, prophets and evangelists from across the length and breadth of this country will be proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel in sister churches throughout Oklahoma City during week night, noonday and late night services.

St. John is doing something a little different this year. Instead of a three-day revival, we will have a one-day revival service on April 24th during the 10:45 worship service. We will also

have two guest speakers...that's right, two sermons all at 10:45. Preaching for us will be Dr. Rev Freddy Clark, Pastor of the Shalom Church City of Peace Church in St. Louis, MO. Then when anyone was bitten by a snake and looked at the bronze snake, they lived."

You see marriage is more than the glow that some people have imagined it is to be, there is a level of commitment and a bond of unity that must exist.


When we say “*I love*

Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends.*” (ESV) (1Cor. 13:4-8).

This is love as we felt it when God created us in His image and after His likeness. It is the love Adam felt when he awoke and saw Eve. Think what this could do for our marriage. If we could always be “*patient and kind*,” were never “*rude*” and never “*insisted on*” getting our “*own way*” it would greatly enhance our relationship! If we never al-

Bio of Lee Andrew Edwards, II

Lee Andrew Edwards II serves as the Executive Pastor of Kingdom Life Fellowship in McKinney, TX. He preached his first sermon in McKinney, TX under the leadership of his father at the age of eighteen. Lee helped his father found Kingdom Life Fellowship where he serves as the Executive Pastor, in 2010 with 66 members and has seen growth in spirit and numbers. Their vision is to

R.E.A.C.H the community for the Kingdom of God.

Lee is the son of Pastor Lee A. and Donna Edwards and has one brother, Paul Edwards. He was born November 14, 1987, in Dallas, Texas. He graduated from Plano East Senior High School in 2006. During his senior year, he accepted the call to preach the gospel of Christ.

Lee has completed his Bachelor of Arts from Dallas Baptist University and a M.DIV with a concentration in theology from Truett Theological Seminary at Baylor.

Bio of Reverend Dr. Freddy J. Clark

Reverend Dr. Freddy J. Clark, a native of St. Louis, accepted a call to preach the gospel at a young age. Since that time, he has been the pastor of several churches and twenty-six years ago founded the Shalom

Church (City of Peace) where preaching, teaching, and praying are the foundational pillars of his ministry.

Dr. Clark earned a Bachelor of Arts in Religion and Philosophy from Bishop College in Dallas, Texas. He earned both a Master of Divinity and a Doctor of Ministry from Eden Theological Seminary. Most recently, Dr. Clark received an Honorary Doctorate in Divinity from Eden Seminary in 2017.

He has served several organizations and boards: Board of Directors, Christian Hospital; Advisory Board Member, iHeartMedia, Inc.; Chaplain, North St. Louis County Precinct, St. Louis County Police Department; and Commissioner, Metro, Inc. (formerly *Bi-State Transit Authority*).

Dr. Clark has published two sermons, *The King Has*

Come and Samson's Weakness as well as his doctoral dissertation, *Hospitality: An Ecclesiological Practice in Ministry*.

His leadership in civic, personal and health-related causes is recognized both locally and nationally. Dr. Clark is responsible for organizing one of the largest church-sponsored health fairs in the nation. He was also one of the co-leaders of A Call to Oneness, a local march that garnered the support of over 20,000 African American men.

He is a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. and 100 Black Men of Metropolitan St. Louis and Lifetime Member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). Dr. Clark is married to the former Cheryl Waller and they have 3 adult children, Terrence, Anthony, and Michelle.

Remember Those That Are In Prison

Matthew 25:36 "I was in prison and you came to see me"!



Even the most broken lives and situations can be restored and made whole when we respond to God's call to serve men and women behind bars.

Every person is made in the image of God. No life is beyond His reach. We are called to serve all those affected by crime and people who are incarcerated and to see lives and communities restored in and out of prison. Let's keep obeying and serving God, one transformed life at a time. The Bible tells us "What we do for the least of them we do unto Jesus Christ."

Prison Ministry is one of the most life-changing experiences you can ever imagine. I serve in the jails doing Prison Ministry most every Sunday. It is a blessing. We minister to about 55 guys weekly. We speak the Word, we pray for them and their families, we are helping develop life-skills, character and preparing them to re-enter our world. Most of these men have been forgotten about. They have no one reaching out and encouraging them. We are all one bad decision away from being where they are.

Let's not forget and let's focus on serving these men and women who are sometimes hopeless. It's when someone is at rock bottom that we must point men and women who are hopeless to Jesus Christ. In our lowest point in life, God can do His greatest work.

Pray about how you can help us take the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the world inside and outside the walls of the prison. Here is what you can do to help and serve with us:

1. We need you to pray for the inmates, their families, the

prison staff, the chaplains and wardens

2. We need you to provide paperback bibles

3. We need you to pray about becoming a pen pal.

Listen to these testimonies...

• GOD TOOK THE CRAVING AWAY:

From a guy loosed from a BIG stronghold: "I am clean so far from having a habit of ½ gram of drugs a week (about \$200 a week in prison) and lots of cigarettes! I tried to smoke a cigarette and got sick instantly! No one could take that craving away from me but the One who said "For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds"! (II Cor. 10:3,4)

• FROM CURSES TO BLESSINGS:

From a woman who has moved from curses to God's blessings: "My grandmother, mother, and many relatives are practicing witches! I was ready to repent for that generational curse, and as I did, I was relieved of bad dreams and severe headaches! I want the blessings for a thousand generations to follow my children, and I thank God for coming to set me free!"

• FROM A STRUGGLING MAN, ONCE BLIND, BUT NOW I CAN SEE:

"I have experienced blurred vision in both of my eyes for approximately 7 months! Tonight, while class was going on, I could not see the faces of those speaking. All I saw was blurred forms of them! I waited a while, trying to squint my eyes, hoping to see better. I motioned some of the team over to pray for my eyes. They anointed my eyes with oil

and prayed the prayer of faith over me. Afterwards, my vision cleared up! And still is! I HAVE BEEN HEALED TONIGHT OF BAD VISION IN JESUS NAME!"

• I HAVE BEEN CHANGED:

From a young man who tried to die, but now lives for Christ: "My dad was an alcoholic and drug addict! He emotionally, mentally, physically, and sexually abused me at a very young age! No one would believe me, and when my grandma died when I was 15, I too turned to drugs and alcohol. I have just come back to a loving heavenly Father during this class and I believe that if God can change

me, He can change you! I now know that "we can do anything through Christ who strengthens us!"

These are just a few testimonies of real lives that have been touched and transformed. Join us in prayer as we take the "Good News" to those who need emotional healing and a hope and a future inside the walls of prison. I am excited to partner with Rev. 
We are also thanking God for newly appointed 2nd Vice-
