#### The Pastor's Pen


Beloved Members,

The missionary returned home, retelling his unusual story, and a member of his church said, "We had a prayer meeting that night, and I took the roll. There were 27 of us present."

That missionary was completing his kingdom assignment to spread the gospel, but so were the 27 church members. You don't need a passport to fulfill the Great Commission. Through the fervent prayer of the people at home, that missionary and his family were able to safely continue carrying out the call God had for them in reaching people in a distant nation!


I also have gone through some difficult times in my life. I remember going to college with financial difficulties. I remember when I had to put a brick under my back tire in order that my car would not roll



## **Annual Back To School Sunday - 2021**

August 22, 2021 is Back-To-School Sunday at St. John. The program is an annual event implemented through the St. John Scholarship Committee which is under the prayerful leadership of Pastor M.L. Jemison and church leaders. The committee's theme is "IN-**VESTING IN OUR YOUTH:** Expecting their Best." The purposes are to celebrate learning; to encourage all who are involved to participate actively in the educational process; and to challenge students to give their best efforts toward preparing themselves for opportunities that will come.

The guest speaker for the back to school program is Reverend Sean A. Jarrett, Senior Pastor of the New Jerusalem Baptist Church, Tulsa. His bio is as follows:

Sean Jarrett serves as the Senior Pastor of New Jerusalem Tulsa, affectionately known as New J, in the North Tulsa, Okla-

homa community. Pastor Jarrett's ability to proclaim the Gospel in a way that honors God's truth while giving practical guidance on how to apply those truths has led many people to experience love and encounter family at New J. Since the age of 10, Pastor Jarrett has not only had a heart for God's Word, but he's also had a heart for God's people.

His call to ministry has been shaped by a foundational desire to minister to underserved urban communities - a call reminiscent of Luke 4:18-19 when Jesus said "The Spirit of the Lord is on me because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." He has walked out his call to empower underserved communities, not only through his work as the Senior Pastor of New Jerusalem Tulsa, but also through his advocacy and partnership with community organizations such as the Margaret Hudson Foundation and the North Tulsa Community Education Task Force where he has served as a board member. His latest effort to empower the underserved North Tulsa community includes his partnership with

Habitat for Humanity to establish affordable housing.

Pastor Jarrett is a graduate of the University of Arkansas and is currently pursuing his Masters of Divinity at Phillips Theological Seminary with a designation in Black Church Studies. Sean is married to his college sweetheart, Tiffany, has two daughters, Dasija and Isabella, and has three sons, Daniel, Drake, and Dylan.

# Half an Hour of Silence in Heaven

"There was silence throughout heaven for about half an hour...Then... incense was given to him to mix with the prayers of God's people." — Revelation 8:1, 3

There was silence in heaven for about half an hour—to bring the prayers of the saints before God. Many of God's children have also felt the absolute need of silence and withdrawal from the things of earth for half an hour—to present their prayers before God. In so doing, they have been strengthened for their daily work.

How often the complaint is heard that there is no time for prayer. Yet often the confession is made that, even if time could be found, one feels unable to spend the time in real communion with God. Don't think "I will not know how to spend the time." Just believe that, if you bow in silence before God, He will reveal Himself to you.

# Opiod Awareness/Substance Abuse Virtual Conference-2021

The Family Support Ministry will, once again, participate in Overdose Awareness Day on August 31st. The Skydance Bridge will be lit up in Purple, at our request, to celebrate this international occasion. Please take note and drive by this beautiful bridge.

We are also proud to announce that we will partner with the Conference of Churches to highlight this event. The names of our Deacons - Greg DeMartra, Ben Langs, and Greg McCoy have been suggested to participate in the panel along with others in the community that have expertise in the mental health and substance abuse field. They will be an asset to the panel giving their input, worthwhile information, and testimonies. The time and link will be announced as we get closer to August 31st.

Also, for your information, the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics currently has 184 drug disposal boxes located in law enforcement lobbies across the state. This year notes the 10th anniversary of a partnership aimed at reducing the theft and abuse of home prescription medication that is often



targeted by teens or friends/relatives with an Opiod addiction. OBN started the "Safe Trips for Scripts" program which involved installing permanent drug take-bake boxes in law enforcement lobbies. It allows citizens to safely dispose of unwanted home medication, year-round. The drugs collected from the program are transported to Covanta Energy in Tulsa for destruction. So, if you have unwanted drugs in your home please take advantage of this opportunity to have them disposed of properly. In 2020, drug overdose deaths in the United States reached an all-time high at over 93,000 as Oklahoma also set a record of 1,002 drugrelated fatalities. Often these fatal and nonfatal overdoses can be linked to medication stolen from home. According to surveys, nearly half of today's youth (47%) say it is easy to obtain prescription drugs from a parent's medicine cabinet, and 75% of heroin users reported they began their addiction by obtaining Opiods from the medicine cabinets of family and friends. So, please take advantage of this program by dropping them off at your local police department.



## **Evangelism Ministry Update!**

Saturday, July 18, 2021 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., Evangelism and Prison Ministries were right in the middle of the Challenge-MINISTER TO THE RESI-DENTS OF MCGUIRE PLAZA. You gave us clothes for men, women, boys and girls—shoes, belts, costume jewelry, hair spray, wigs, some can goods and hygiene items...we gave it to them. The residents in the majority are older, but range from the 20(s) on up. There were some parents with children. There were Blacks and Whites. Residents had mental and physical challenges—speech impediments, amputated limbs, and some were wheel chair bound. They signed in and were allowed to shop for free and to take what they could

carry. The residents echoed the sentiments of some staff without knowing what we had said "this is really nice". The residents seemed surprised that we were present with something nice for them. Some residents reported only having the clothing they were wearing. A young ROTC graduate came "My grandmother said if I came down here, I could get some clothes". He got clothes and Margaret Richardson took a picture of him Sunday morning in full suit and tie going to Church. (He wanted clothes to interview in.) ST. JOHN, YOU MET THE NEED AND WE THANK YOU AND WE THANK GOD. IT WAS A SPIRITUAL EXPERIENCE. ..."I was naked and you clothed me....even as you have done to the least of these, you have done it unto me..."
Many of the residents were very grateful and said "GOD BLESS YOU" (to us). St. John met the need and ST. JOHN SHARED THE GOSPEL (IN THE FORMAT) "GOD'S LETTER TO YOU".

The workers put in a whole day's work starting at 8:00 a.m. and they reported they worked until 3:30 p.m. "a whole Oklahoma City Public School work day".
